# 1. Pop-Up Event Overview

### Discussion

The Town of Ramapo has initiated an update to its 2004 Town of Ramapo Comprehensive Plan to reflect the needs of today and to identify a vision for the unincorporated Monsey, Hillcrest, and Western Ramapo area's future. The Comprehensive Plan Update and Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS) for the unincorporated Monsey, Hillcrest, and Western Ramapo areas will serve as a roadmap for future land use, housing, transportation, and other infrastructure policy and investment. The update will address emerging challenges while ensuring growth aligns with the community's vision and goals.

The Comprehensive Plan Update process is being developed by the Town of Ramapo and a consultant team led by M.J. Engineering, Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Land Surveying, P.C.

On Wednesday, April 16, 2025, MJ staff hosted a pop-up table at the Town of Ramapo Safety Extravaganza Carnival on Wednesday, April 16, 2025, engaging with more than 200 attendees, including many youths and teens. Attendees were invited to share their top three (3) challenges and opportunities currently experienced in the unincorporated areas of Monsey, Hillcrest, and Western Ramapo. Attendees used sticky dots to indicate on boards what their top three priorities or challenges were based on the topics presented.

The tabling event provided a platform for residents to ask questions, interact with the MJ staff, and learn about the Town of Ramapo Comprehensive Plan Update. Information flyers promoting the community survey were distributed to attendees interested in contributing further input. Feedback collected at the event will inform the development of the Comprehensive Plan's vision and goals.





# 2. Priorities / Opportunities

# **Discussion**

This station encouraged participants to share their insights about priorities and opportunities for unincorporated Monsey, Hillcrest, and Western Ramapo areas.

The top three (3) priorities/ opportunities include: Improve walking and biking connections (73 votes), expanding recreation opportunities and public spaces (63 votes), and infrastructure improvements (43 votes).

### Comments raised included:

 Many participants who felt preservation of land/open space was a priority had been a longtime resident of the Town

# Other ideas expressed through this exercise include (in no particular order and presented as written):

- Traffic lights at Union/Twin/Anthony/Elm since there are a lot of accidents/crashes there. Thank you for helping us stay safe!
- Sidewalks on Hungry Hollow and Old Nyack
- More 4 way stop signs and green left turning arrows, Cedar to Route 306 and Old Nyack Turnpike
- Child safety and places for children to play
- Bus tracking system
- Grandview needs more sidewalks

# 3. Issues and Challenges

# 3. Issues and Challenges

### Discussion

The top three (3) issues/ challenges include: pedestrian safety and walkability (29 votes), traffic congestion (25 votes), and lack of housing types/ options and affordability (11 votes).

### Comments and concerns raised include:

- Many noted that they felt the effects of rapid growth such as safety and traffic congestion were a challenge
